  - b. Department Head reports.
    - i. Chief Potvin reported Drug take back day was Saturday April 27<sup>th</sup> from 10-2 pm; The Autism Walk was scheduled for Sunday and Bradley Street would be closed on April 30<sup>th</sup> for an hour.
    - ii. Chief Dufresne said there would be an open house at the Main Street fire station May 18<sup>th</sup> from 10 2 PM.
